### **Grandma's Christmas Memories Inspire Novel**

A few years ago at Christmastime, while visiting his grandmother, Anna Snyder, in LaVale, MD, John Snyder began asking her about her childhood, about her Christmas memories, and what it was like growing up in the early 1900s in Meyersdale, PA. As they sat at the kitchen table eating left-over Christmas cookies and sipping their coffee, the elder Snyder told her grandson about one Christmas, in particular, that was her most memorable.

Snyder was so intrigued by the tale; he drove from LaVale to Meyersdale with his wife and his two daughters to visit the small western Pennsylvania town where his grandmother grew up, and where his father was born.

The town remained much as Snyder remembered it from his childhood visits there to see his great-grandmother, Elda Beal. When he arrived at the address of his grandmother's memories, Snyder discovered that the house was gone and the lot vacant. As he stood there in the snow, he tried to visualize his grandmother's childhood home as he replayed her story in his head.

On the more than 3-hour drive back to his home, Snyder couldn't stop thinking about the story. As he tapped his finger on the steering wheel in time to a Christmas tune playing on the car stereo, the idea occurred to him that he should write down the story his grandmother told him so his children would always have her Christmas memory. Hopefully, they would pass it along to their children – and the story would live within his family forever.

Over the next few years, Snyder wrote and re-wrote different versions of the story, adding to it and elaborating on the tale. "What started out as a short story for my daughters, ended up as this 184-page hardcover Christmas gift book entitled THE GOLDEN RING", said Snyder.

The advancing age of his grandmother served as strong motivation for him to complete his mission. And ninety, she was in excellent health, but he knew that soon time would take her from him. Unable to find a publisher, Snyder decided to publish the book himself ... and he did. Initially, he printed 5,000 copies. Snyder anxiously awaited its arrival from the printer and with great anticipation he was finally able to place a copy of THE GOLDEN RING in her hand. "I still vividly remember her enthusiastic smile when she held the finished book for the first time."

The hometown newspaper was there for the occasion. It was writing an article about Mrs. Snyder, and the book written by her grandson. The last photograph taken of Snyder's grandmother was taken by the newspaper photographer for the feature article. Ironically, Snyder's grandmother quietly passed away in her sleep just days later. She would never have the opportunity to read the article.

“I remember how beautiful she looked that day. I remember the joy in her eyes when I gave her the book. We buried my grandmother on the day before Thanksgiving – one day before the article was published. With her, we buried her copy of THE GOLDEN RING,” the author said.

After its release, THE GOLDEN RING quickly became a best seller everywhere it was available. All 5,000 copies sold out that year. The following year Snyder printed 25,000 copies. It was among the top selling books in the Washington, DC DMA, outselling many books atop the *New York Times Bestseller List*, as THE GOLDEN RING was featured in *Family Circle Magazine* and other media, both local and national. Between October and December of that year, all 25,000 copies were sold.

People stood in long lines at book signings to have Snyder personalize their copy. Snyder recalls going to one book signing and seeing a long line leading from the front doors of a Borders Bookstore to the signing table near the rear of the store. “I thought perhaps there was a well known author who had a signing before me and that there was still a line,” Snyder said. “The closer I got to the signing table; it became more apparent that all those people were there for me. I signed books, one after another, for a solid 2-hours without a break. What a tremendously gratifying feeling.” He said.

Snyder was surprised at how deeply his book touched many of those who read it. “I receive many letters, e-mails and telephone calls from readers all over the world who have the nicest things to say.” At book signings, some were moved to tears when telling Snyder how deeply they were touched by the story.

Due to the success of the self published edition of THE GOLDEN RING, Warner Books signed Snyder to a book contract. Additionally, a prominent German publisher purchased the German language rights and published the book in Germany. Snyder's relationship with Warner Books was a rocky one, as they failed to sell as many books as Snyder did on his own. As a result, the author sought and received a reversion of rights to his work. He purchased the remaining Warner Books stock and is now selling both versions of the book.

The story is set in a small Pennsylvania town in the year 1918. It takes readers back to a nostalgic era when times were simpler. “THE GOLDEN RING is a touching Christmas story about giving, faith, love and loss. It is a good, wholesome story that has family appeal,” said Snyder. “People of all ages, both men and women, have told me they have enjoyed the book tremendously.”

Snyder just completed another book; JACOB'S BELL and is awaiting publication. He is also working with a well-known producer in LA writing a screenplay for THE GOLDEN RING.
